These include maintenance inspections, pre-renovation inspections, problem resolution inspections, litigation inspections, energy audits, commercial inspections, and more.



What's In It For You?

Let's do some math. As a home inspector, with some experience, you can earn \$100,000 per year, how?

If you do 250 inspections per year (that is about 4hrs of work per day)

x \$400/ inspection

= \$100,000

You do not need an advanced degree.




An advanced degree is not required to become a building inspector. We find those who are good with people and have an interest in how things work make excellent building inspectors.

What Building Inspectors Do

For most people in Canada, buying a home will probably be the biggest investment they will ever make. However, unlike buying a car or an appliance, your home does not come with a guarantee. The best way to protect your investment is to use a certified home inspector. The home inspection industry is overseen by several different organizations. And in this document we will cover some of them.

What is involved in doing a home inspection?

Building inspectors ensure that construction meets local and national building codes and ordinances, zoning regulations, and contract specifications.



A home inspector will evaluate the interior and exterior of a structure, looking for several things (including but not necessarily limited to the following list).

A good inspector will:

- Check all electrical outlets, switches and the fuse/breaker panel.
- Flush toilets and turn on faucets to make sure they work and to determine water pressure.
- Open and close all the windows.
- Check the floors, walls and ceilings for any defects.
- Check the basement or foundation for any water leakage.
- Inspect the heating and cooling systems.
- Check out the attic and any crawl spaces to assess insulation.
- · Examine in the closets and under the stairs.

- Inspect chimneys and flues (in some cases chimneys require an additional inspection from a specialist).
- · Inspect roof and eavestroughs.
- Look around the entire exterior of the building structure looking for signs of weather damage.
- Look for any issues with exterior decks and railings.
- Inspect the foundation looking for cracks or other issues
- Check the grading around the foundation.
- And more...



What Skills Are Needed to Succeed?

Do you need a background in construction to be a successful home inspector? Absolutely not. You can learn the skills of home inspection through a good education program.



- You need to be able to speak with homebuyers, sellers and owners, and with real estate professionals.
- You need to be able to write at a high school level, although you do not need to be a trained technical writer.
- You need to be comfortable with technology such as mobile phones, tablets and personal computers. You need to be comfortable with the Internet, email and text.
- You need to be able to climb a ladder and crawl in crawlspaces. You need training and experience specific to the profession.

How Do I Get Started?

There are six steps to InterNACHI certification:

- Step #1: Join InterNACHI Qc & pass the Online Inspector Examination. At Mose Home Inspection Services we will assign you a mentor to assist you in studying and passing the exam.
- Step #2: Complete the Code of Ethics Course
- Step #3: Complete the Standards of Practice Course

- Step #4: Pass the InterNACHI Qc. Evaluation report
- Step #5: Do the assigned number of assigned inspections as a ride along with a MHIS inspector.
- Step #6: Pass a mock inspection in the company of an InterNACHI inspector.
- Step #7: Join the MHIS team!
